

NGOS' ROLES IN PROMOTING DEMOCRACY

PUBLIC EDUCATION

EFFECTIVE DEMOCRACY RESTS ON INFORMED CITIZENS AND CIVIL SOCIETY ASSOCIATIONS CAN HELP TO MAKE PEOPLE MORE KNOWLEDGEABLE ABOUT ECONOMIC GLOBALIZATION AND HOW IT IS REGULATED.

PUBLIC DEBATE

EFFECTIVE DEMOCRACY DEPENDS ON OPEN DELIBERATION OF DIVERSE VIEWS AND OPTIONS.

CIVIL SOCIETY GROUPS CAN HELP TO PREVENT ANY SINGLE POLICY FRAMEWORK FROM GAINING AN AUTHORITARIAN MONOPOLY OVER GOVERNANCE OF THE GLOBAL ECONOMY.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

EFFECTIVE DEMOCRACY REQUIRES AN ENGAGED CITIZENRY, AND CIVIL SOCIETY BODIES CAN HELP TO GIVE PEOPLE CHANNELS OF POLITICAL INVOLVEMENT.

PUBLIC TRANSPARENCY

EFFECTIVE DEMOCRACY ENTAILS VISIBLE GOVERNANCE, AND CIVIL SOCIETY EFFORTS CAN HELP TO BRING GOVERNANCE OF THE GLOBAL ECONOMY INTO PUBLIC VIEW.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTABILITY

EFFECTIVE DEMOCRACY NEEDS CITIZEN MONITORING AND CONTROL OF AUTHORITIES, AND CIVIL SOCIETY ASSOCIATIONS CAN HELP TO HOLD GOVERNORS OF THE GLOBAL ECONOMY ANSWERABLE TO THE GOVERNED.



One Belt and One Road Initiative









ASIAN NGOS (CONSULTATIVE STATUS) BY NATION




ASIAN NGOS (BY ACTIVITY SCOPE)

UN ECOSOC NGOs by Activity Scope






ASIAN NGOS (BY ACTIVITY SECTOR)



5. MZ'S NEW STRATEGIES FOR ENRICHING TRANSNATIONAL SOLIDARITY IN MILKTEA ALLIANCE

- MZ GENERATION'S BROKERAGE ROLE IN ASIANIZATION
 - PARTICIPATION NETWORK FROM BELOW, STRONG SOLIDARITY THROUGH SOCIAL MEDIA (EX: WATER MOVEMENTS)
 - THE DIGITAL REVOLUTION: DIGITAL GENERATION, INFORMATION SHARING VIA TELEGRAM; STREET ART OF THE SOCIAL WEB
 - TALKING POLITICS AND DELIBERATIVE DEMOCRACY
- MEMES (MEME MOVEMENT)
 - MEANING CREATION AND SOCIAL COMPOSITION, FRAME WAR, COGNITIVE LIBERATION, ACTIVE ONLINE SPACE MOBILIZATION
 - IMITATION, SATIRE, CARICATURE, FUN (PLEASANT MOVEMENT), IMAGE, CULTURAL SHARED IDENTITY, ETC.





MZ-LED NEW REPERTOIRE OF PROTESTS: MOBILIZING SOCIAL MEDIA & MEMES STRATEGY

- INTERNET MEMES ARE ONE OF THE NEWEST
 CREATIVE FORMS, BORN OF DIGITAL CULTURE
 AND IN DIALOGUE WITH OFFLINE, FROM SUCH
 DAILY ISSUES AS COMPLAINING ABOUT A MOVIE
 OR CHEERING ON SPORTS TEAMS TO HEAVIER
 ISSUES ABOUT SOCIAL JUSTICE AND HUMAN
 RIGHTS.
- MEME CULTURE. MEMES CAN BE SILLY, HARMLESS, DESTRUCTIVE, EXTREMELY SERIOUS, AND ALL THESE THINGS AT THE SAME TIME.
- PHOTO REMIXES, SELFIES, YOUTUBE SONGS, HASHTAG JOKES, THAT IS, SILLY STUFF OF MEME CULTURE BUT DEEPLY INTERTWINED WITH SERIOUS MESSAGES/ MEANING-MAKING.

"The meme war can count as the inception of a new transnational movement comparable to the globalization-critical movement of the early 2000s."

"The meme war was a confrontation between young Thai, Hong Kong, and Taiwanese pro-democracy activists versus state-sponsored trolls from the People's Republic of China. (censorship)"

GLOCAL CHALLENGES: PLATFORM ECONOMY, RETURN TO THE PAST?


- Invisible Control (algorithm domination)
 - "We are easily connected but incompetent."
- Sustaining Civic Engagement in Local Community
 - Social Value vs. Interest Value (Developmentalism)
 - Volunteering and civic participation
- Sharing but Hustling
 - Flexibility?
 - Returning to the past (work exploitation)
 - Work-Life Balance? (lacking social life)
 - Fear of being removed from the community or deactivated

ALGOCRACY: ALGOCRATIC SYSTEM

ALGOCRACY (J. DANAHER 2016)

- DATA-MINING SYSTEMS: RELYING ON EXTREMELY LARGE DATASETS (BIG DATA), COLLECTED FROM GROWING NETWO RKS OF DATA-MONITORING TECHNOLOGIES. HUMANS CAN BE MORE OR LESS INVOLVED IN THE DATA-MINING PROCES S AND IN THE KINDS OF DECISIONS MADE ON FOOT OF THE DATA-MINING PROCESS.
- A THREAT OF ALGOCRACY: ARISING FROM THIS SORT OF EPISTEMIC FAVORING OF ALGOCRATIC SYSTEMS. EPISTEMIC S
 YSTEMS FAIL TO SATISFY IMPORTANT LEGITIMACY CONDITIONS OF GENERAL ACCEPTABILITY, REASONABLE REJECTA
 BILITY, AND PUBLICITY. FAVORING ALGOCRATIC GOVERNANCE SYSTEMS IMPRESSED BY THEIR GREATER SPEED, ACCU
 RACY AND INSIGHT. BUT IN FAVORING THEM WE MAY END UP WITH SYSTEMS THAT ARE INCREASINGLY OPAQUE.
- TRAPPED IN A WEB OF "INVISIBLE BARBED WIRE" THE ALGORITHMIC CONTROL SYSTEMS ENHANCE OUR AUTONOMY, I NCREASE OUR HEALTH AND WELL- BEING, AND IMPROVE SOCIAL OUTCOMES, BUT WE DON'T HAVE CLEAR SENSE OF HOW EXACTLY THEY MANAGE TO DO THIS. THE RESULT IS SOCIAL SPACES THAT ARE OPAQUE TO HUMAN REASON.
- LESS LEGITIMATE DECISION-MAKING PROCEDURES: LESS HUMAN PARTICIPATION IN OR LESS COMPREHENSION OF TH

 OSE DECISION-MAKING PROCEDURES. RELIANCE ON ALGOCRATIC SYSTEMS IS A THREAT TO LEGITIMATE DECISION-M

 AKING PROCEDURES.

Active Engagement against Algorracy



Radical Transparency Strategy from the Bottom Up

- Big Data Algorithms: Monitoring and Incentivizing Political and Socio—Economic Activities
- Strengthen surveillance of the political and economic elites
- Voluntary participation and solidarity activities of grassroots citizens
- New technology mobilization strategy (e.g.) Google glass, and similar wearable monitoring devices
- Balancing surveillance and privacy
- Distributed strategy rather than information and data concentration
