

- Exploring light community strategy of struggling with neoliberalism while facing fragmented individualism as well as digital revolution.
- Assuming a light community as a democratic place in which we creatively and actively discovers meaningful solutions for lifelong care.
- Light community is an open space where anyone can move around. It is a space of cooperation that overcomes strong connections such as gender, age, class, and race/tribe, and recognizes and respects participants as others.
- Exploring how grassroots people learn light community strategies through regular contact and meetings.
- Examining light community experiments as a place for incubating rooted cosmopolitan equipped with cooperative values in a glocal contexts. It means to be a healthy 'Rooted Cosmopolitan' growing from below.
- Meaningful innovations and alternatives can be created through mutual deliberation and communication through collaborative projects.


